HAPPY HOLIDAYS & WELCOME TO WINTER



2018 Annual FISHARAMA

The Tri-Lakes Community Center's 53rd Annual FISHARAMA will take place on Saturday February 4, 2018 from noon to 4pm. The fishing contest fee is \$3.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children under 12 years of age. Contestants will be able to pay and register their fish on the ice. (The fishing contest fee is separate from the cost of the annual raffle tickets.)

Contest prizes will be awarded in the "longest pan fish" and the "longest other legal fish" categories caught in both the adult and children's divisions. In the adult division, prize baskets will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners. Cash prizes of \$100, \$75, and \$50 will be awarded to 5th, 10th and 15th place. In the children's division (12 and under), cash prizes of \$30, \$20, and \$10 will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. Winners will also be presented with a medal.

As in the past, food and beverages will be available for purchase "on the ice". 50/50 raffle tickets will be available for \$1.00/each or 6 for \$5.00. At 4 pm winners of all fish categories, the 50/50 raffle and the annual raffle winners will be drawn and announced.

TLCC volunteers will drill holes upon request for contestants. In the event of adverse weather/ice conditions occur, the contest registration and prize drawings will take place at the boat landing on Amnicon Lake. In this case, there will be no parking available at the landing

The Annual FISHARAMA is an event which people look forward to each February. The TLCC wishes all fisherman and women good luck. We hope to see everyone on the ice!!

Please keep in mind: the cost of the raffle tickets will be separate from any fishing contest fees.

The raffle prizes will be as follows: - 1st Place — \$300; 2nd Place — \$200; 3rd Place — \$100.


ANNUAL FALL TURKEY BINGO
