# 2019 Annual FISHARAMA

The Tri Lakes Community Center's 54th Annual Fisharama will take place on Saturday, February 2nd from noon until 4:00 P.M. The fishing contest fee is \$3.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children under the age of



twelve. Contestants will be able to pay and register their live fish on the ice. This fee is separate from the annual winter raffle ticket fundraiser.

Contest prizes will be awarded in the "longest live pan fish" and the "longest live other legal fish" categories caught in both the adult and children's divisions. In the adult division; prize baskets will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places. Cash prizes of \$100, \$75 and \$50 will be awarded to 5th, 10th and 15th places. In the children's division cash prizes of \$30, \$20 and \$10 will be awarded to 1st,

2nd and 3rd places. Winners in the children's division will also be presented with a medal.
