As a property owner, you are automatically a member of the Amnicon Dowling Lake Management District (ADLMD). We are a taxing unit of government. You will see a line on your property tax bill with the portion of the tax levy you are required to pay.

The Lake District focuses on these general areas:

- We work to preserve and protect the lakes and their watersheds.
- We inform and educate our members through materials included in mailings or speakers.
- At our summer Annual Meeting, guest speakers are occasionally invited to speak.
- We monitor the water quality of the lakes and do other studies to determine future actions of the district.

To further help communication in the District, we have developed a website. We will be using the website to keep our residents informed on ADLMD activities and opportunities for our residents. Check back often.

Amnicon and Dowling Lakes are shallow, bog-fed, glacially created lakes. In relation to their surface area, they contain relatively little water and are very sensitive to what is put in them and people’s activities around them.

We encourage you to keep your tree and plant cutting to a minimum and avoid using blacktop or other paving on your property. Our lakes have many natural sources of nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorous, the same elements found in inorganic fertilizers. We encourage everyone to minimize or eliminate the use of inorganic fertilizer. Also, we hope all owners carefully monitor their personal septic systems and keep them from polluting the lakes.

The Lake Management District cannot take care of your property for you, but we can offer information and guidance.

**Monthly Meetings** are held March – October at 6:00 P.M. normally on the last Monday of the month at the Community Center. Occasionally this time and date is changed. Please check the website for current meeting dates and times.

**Annual Meeting 2022** will be held on June 11, 11:00 A.M. at the Tri Lakes Community Center.
