

58th FISHARAMA FUNDRAISER

Saturday, February 1, 2025 Noon – 4:00 P.M.

The 2025 Fisharama Fundraiser will consist of both adult and children's divisions with the following fish categories:

*Pan Fish *Northern *Other Legal Fish

Adult division first place contestants will be awarded \$100.00 for the "longest LIVE fish" caught in each category. Children's division first place contestants will be awarded \$25.00 for the "longest LIVE fish" caught in each category.

In addition, all anglers will be eligible to win prizes in the "Fish Caught Drawing". With each registered fish, contestants will be entered into the drawing.

The fishing contest fee is \$10.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children under twelve years of age. As in the past, food and beverages will be available for purchase. Annual raffle tickets will be sold with "on the ice" drawings held every fifteen minutes starting at 12:15 P.M. Beginning at 4:30 the 50/50 raffle drawing and annual raffle ticket winners will be drawn, followed by the fishing contest winners.

An ice auger will be available upon request for the contestants. In the event of adverse weather/ice conditions, the contest registration and prize drawings will take place at the boat landing on Amnicon Lake. In this case, there will be no parking available at the landing.

The annual Fisharama FUNDRAISER is an event that people look forward to each February. The TLCC wishes all fishing contestants good luck. We hope to see everyone on the ice!

Please keep in mind: the cost of the raffle tickets is separate from any fishing contest fees.

This spring, the Comprehensive Planning Grant awarded by the WI DNR received final approval. This means that the District now has an approved 10– year Strategic Plan.

Seven goals were established, with specific prioritized objectives and activities associated with each goal.

The District has begun moving forward to implement these goals and objectives. Committees for each of the goals have been established, and although the District does not hold regular board meetings in the winter, the committees are planning on working through the winter. Please keep a watch out for any upcoming meetings as they are posted at the neighborhood eating establishments, the TLCC clubhouse, Nextdoor Neighbor and Facebook. Please check out the goals and volunteer to participate on one or more of the committees. Active stakeholder participation is critical for the successful implementation of the plan (see goal seven). If not, the district will need to raise the tax levy to contract out the work.

Strategic Plan Goals

Shoreline and Near Shore Goal: Implement shoreline and near shore practices to improve the water quality and habitat of the lakes.

Educational Goal: Provide educational opportunities and information to Stakeholders and the public.

Fisheries Goal: Improve Quality of Fisheries & Fisheries Habitat of the lakes.

Recreation Goal: Oversight of Recreational Usage of Amnicon and Dowling Lakes to ensure a safe and healthy multipurpose recreational environment.

Aquatic Plants Goal: Manage and Control both Native and Invasive Aquatic Plants.

Water Quality Goal: Reduce external and internal nutrient loading in both lakes and in their watersheds to achieve a water quality that will support a healthy lake ecosystem.

Plan Implementation and Amendment Goal: Follow through with the implementation of the plan. Review yearly and amend if necessary.

Buildings and Grounds

Cost effective repairs were completed last year. The buildings and grounds committee will continue to meet to plan, estimate costs and prioritize future maintenance projects in order to conserve energy, prevent further damage to the building and manage upkeep. A general maintenance plan and timeline will preserve the integrity of the building and save money annually for the TLCC. The committee members will inspect the center, the pavilion and the garage to determine if any other repairs need to be done other than the following known items that need to be addressed:

- Installation of two new doors.
- 2. Repair stucco on basement walls and paint.
- 3. Finish the back storage room.
- 4. Seal exterior of the back of the building for pest control.
- 5. Paint the upstairs.
- 6. Create a special fund for future building issues. Even though equipment is working today, the following items are aging: furnace, range, air conditioner & lawn mower.
